Your child received a bump to the head today. There is, so far, no evidence of any serious damage. However, sometimes signs of important injury do not develop for hours after the bump. Watch for these symptoms. If any develop, call your physician or emergency room or take your child to the hospital of your choice.

*The important alerting symptoms are:*

- ***Increased swelling of bump on head***
- ***Severe headache (mild headache is common) or a headache lasting beyond 24 hours***
- ***Vomiting which continues or starts more than six hours after the injury (common in the first few hours)***
- ***Extremely pale skin color***
- ***Daytime drowsiness or a daytime sleep from which the child cannot easily be awakened***
- ***Confusion, irritability, or any change from normal behavior***
- ***Trembling or jerky body movements***
- ***Muscle weakness, falling, unsteadiness, dizziness***
- ***Clear or bloody fluid draining from nose or ears***
- ***Difficulty seeing or double vision***
- ***Labored breathing***
- ***Fever over 100 degrees***
- ***ringing in the ears***
- ***Stiff neck***
